QUIET HOURS

In Wyandotte County/Kansas City, Kansas, the general quiet hours are from 10:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.. During this time, certain noises that are "plainly audible" at a specific distance are restricted, especially in residential areas.

Specific regulations include:

- General Noise Disturbances: Sound from portable, non-vehicular music or sound production devices operated in a public space shall not be plainly audible by any person other than the operator between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m..
- Power Tools/Lawn Equipment: The operation of power tools, lawnmowers, or similar equipment is prohibited in a residential area if the sound is plainly audible across a property boundary line between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m..
- Parties/Gatherings: Congregating in a party or gathering that produces sound disturbing the peace, quiet, or repose of a reasonable person residing in a residential area may result in a police officer ordering dispersion, especially between 10:00 p.m. and 7:00 a.m..
- Decibel Limits: The ordinance also sets specific decibel limits (dB(A)). In residential areas, the outdoor sound pressure level limit is 60 dB(A) between 7 a.m. and 10 p.m., and 55 dB(A) between 10 p.m. and 7 a.m..
- "Plainly Audible" Standard: A "plainly audible" standard can be used by law enforcement, which does not require a sound meter measurement.

These rules are part of the Unified Government of Wyandotte County and Kansas City, Kansas Code of Ordinances and are designed to prevent excessive, unnecessary, or unusually loud noise.

WYANDOTTE COUNTY SHERIFF'S OFFICE 10/29/25. We have received numerous reports today about people getting calls claiming to be from our agency saying that they have missed a court date, have a warrant out for their arrest, etc. The caller will threaten an arrest unless you provide payment. They will try to get money to pay off these "debts" through gift card, Bitcoin, Venmo, CashApp, and many other ways. Please do not fall for this!!

This scam can be hard to detect as scammers are now able to "spoof" calls, which means that they can program it to show up with a caller ID from the "Sheriff's Office". They will use real names of real employees and may sound extremely legitimate.

We will never call you with this kind of information, and we definitely will not request payment of any kind over the phone. If you are unsure if you are being scammed, please hang up the phone and call our office directly at (913) 573-2861.

HELPFUL HINTS ABOUT LIVING IN THE HOMES

PLUMBING: DO NOT FLUSH FLUSHABLE WIPES. The pipes in our homes are over 70 years old. They do not have the capacity to wash away any other material. Do not flush baby wipes, feminine hygiene products, diapers, paper towels, Q tips, etc. The sink and tub drains are only for water disposal. Do not force items down the drains. If maintenance finds these items consistently causing a back up in your pipes you may be charged for the repair.

SECURE YOUR HOME. It is very important that you have a trusted family member or friend on your stock certificate or a TOD (Transfer on Death) or a will specific to your unit. If you do not then the Homes will incur legal debt proving that the Homes has equity in the unit. The Homes will have to take a financial loss because we will not receive HOA fees (Home Owner Assoc. fees – maintenance fees) for an unknown number of months. Plan for your future and the Homes future.

PARKING: The Homes does not have assigned parking. Please be considerate of your neighbors and their parking needs. Try not to park in a spot that is normally used by your neighbor. If you have guest, have them park in the overflow lots. NEVER PARK IN YARDS OR COMMON GROUND. **IT COULD RESULT IN A FINE OF \$250.00**

YARDS & PORCHES: Please take the time to clean up/organize your yard and porch. The size of our porches do not allow for you to keep many items on them before they start to look cluttered and messy. If you do not have a shed an affordable alternative is to store your items in a deck or patio box. They range in cost from \$30 to \$100 and can be purchased on-line or at your local discount store. Items that should not be on your porch: appliances, boxes, buckets, mops, paint containers or any other "non outdoor" items. The office offers free paint for your porch railings.

SPEEDING. The speed limit in The Homes, Inc. is 20 mph. It only takes a few seconds for a distracted child to dart out in the road. Please be aware and safe while driving.

AUTOMOBILE REPAIR. It is against the rules to work on your vehicle in The Homes. If your vehicle needs repair then you will have to take your vehicle out of the neighborhood or take your vehicle to a mechanic. Unless you are changing a flat tire you should NEVER put your vehicle on a jack in the Homes. **IT COULD RESULT IN A FINE OF \$250.00**

LITTERING. Think twice about throwing your trash out your car window or into someone's yard. First, it's rude and selfish. Someone will have to pick it up and most of the time it is the maintenance staff. This takes time and money away from other residents needs. Second, it is against the law. Littering is a Class C violation that is punishable by a fine up to a \$2500.00.

KEEP FURNANCE AND WATER HEATER AREAS CLEAN. Having too many clothes, boxes, or general clutter in your utility area can be a fire hazard. Please keep yourself and your neighbors safe and keep your utility areas clean. DO NOT PILE CLOTHES OR OTHER ITEMS ON TOP OF THE WATER HEATER OR FLU AREA.

CLEANING UP YOUR DOGS WASTE

Wyandotte County requires dog owners to pick up their dog's poop in public areas and on private property not belonging to the owner. It is considered an unlawful discharge and a sanitation issue due to public health and environmental risks. Violations of the animal control ordinance are considered a misdemeanor offense. Fines can vary depending on the specific violation and whether it is a repeat offense, potentially ranging from \$50 to over \$500, in addition to potential court costs or imprisonment in some cases.
